

PROPOSAL FOR FACULTY-LED STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

Follow the steps below to submit a program proposal.

- 1. **Complete proposal form**: Save proposal form as PDF.
- **2. Follow Narrative instructions:** Use the Narrative instructions for full proposal. Include information pertaining to these sections:
 - 1) Background Considerations: Rationale, Viability, Sustainability
 - 2) Academic Profile
 - 3) Program Site
 - 4) Safety, Security, and Health
 - 5) Administration
 - 6) Student Learning & Development
 - 7) Markers of Success

3. Include these supporting documents:

- Budget Worksheet. Work with the Office of Study Abroad coordinator for your program's region and your college's Study Abroad Dean's Designee to develop the program budget. Also address how the proposed cost/value ratio reflects your college's strategy.
- Map showing itinerary/teaching sites.
- **Email letters of support** from all Department Chairs and College Deans/Dean's Designees offering courses on this program. Every department/college offering a course is considered a sponsor.
- **Draft syllabus or outline** for each offered course.
- **Draft itinerary** of program locations and activities.

4. Submit forms, narrative, and supporting documents by the due date:

- Send the proposal form with the narrative and all supporting documents attached to the Executive Director, Office of Study Abroad at pattents.org.
- Email letters of support may be sent separately to the Executive Director, Office of Study Abroad at patte151@msu.edu.
